How well do you know the Bible? Here's 10 Bible quiz questions to test your knowledge. You'll have 10 seconds to record your answers. We'll give you the answers at the end.

You're going to see 10 quotes from some famous Bible Characters but who said them, and who were they talking to? You'll hear the quote, then you need to answer 2 questions: Who is speaking, and who are they speaking to?

You'll have to be quick, remember-there's only 10 seconds per question!

Some are easier than others! Ready? Let's go!

Quote 1:

Quote 2:

Ouote 5:

"Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." This remark was made by Thomas to the other disciples. Thomas wasn't with the disciples when the risen Jesus first appeared

to them. Eight days later, Jesus appeared to all of the disciples. Thomas then believed and said to Jesus "My Lord and my God".

Their only hope was for Queen Esther to go to the king and plead for their lives. Except, she couldn't approach him without his permission without risking death. Maybe God had put her in the royal palace for this very purpose? But what will she do? Read the book of Esther to find out!

Quote 9:

This is Ruth speaking to her mother-in-law, Naomi. Ruth was a Moabite woman, but followed Naomi back to Bethlehem, casting off the gods from Moab and following the God of Israel. She eventually marries a man called Boaz and she's the grandmother of Kind David. If you like a good love story, you'll love the book of Ruth. (Ruth 1:16)

Quote 10:

"And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell." These strong words were proclaimed by Jesus. He was talking to His disciples, preparing them for a missionary journey. He warns them that persecution is coming. He reminds us that it is God we should fear.
